4. Title: Service of notice of emergency protective orders

5. Summary: Provides that a law-enforcement officer may affect service of an emergency protective order by personally serving the person subject to the order with a notification of the issuance of the order, which shall be on a form approved by the Supreme Court of Virginia. The officer making service shall enter or cause to be entered the date and time of service and other appropriate information into the Virginia Criminal Information Network and make due return to the court.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Supreme Court of Virginia, the form required by this bill has already been designed and it will be presented to the Committee on District Courts at its next meeting. The approved version of the form is scheduled to be distributed to the courts prior to July 1 and then distributed to law enforcement officers throughout the Commonwealth via the clerk's offices.

There are a few system modifications the Virginia State Police (VSP) need to implement to comply with this legislation. After conferring with their software systems vendor, VSP estimates the fiscal impact will be approximately \$8,000. It is anticipated the agency can absorb this cost utilizing existing resources.
