- 5. Summary: Authorizes the Marine Resources Commission to assess a fee of \$10 for each ton of menhaden harvested with a purse net. The fees are to be paid to the Commission semiannually and are to be used by the Commission to evaluate the condition of the menhaden fishery. The persons harvesting menhaden are also required to submit a monthly catch report to the Commission. The bill will sunset on July 1, 2016. The bill also provides for a \$1000 per day civil penalty upon any violations. The penalty will be deposited into the Menhaden Assessment Fund also created by the bill.

8. Fiscal Implications: Based on current law, the maximum tonnage of menhaden that may be harvested each year is 109,000 tons. Therefore, multiplying 109,000 tons x \$10 per ton would yield a potential maximum amount of revenue each year of \$1,090,000. It is expected that all of the revenues collected until July 1, 2016 the expiration date for this new fee, would be spent on the evaluation of the menhaden fishery that is described in the bill. Monies would be

used for an annual aerial survey of the menhaden population in Virginia waters. In addition, on-going species research would be done by staff at Virginia Institute of Marine Sciences (VIMS) or at other Virginia research institutions.

In addition, the bill calls for a civil penalty of \$1,000 assessed to any person found in violation of the provisions of this bill. Any monies collected in penalties are to be deposited into the Menhaden Assessment Fund. It is difficult to ascertain how much in civil penalties will be collected.
