- 5. Summary: Creates an administrative procedure that allows the Virginia Marine Resources Commission to convey title to filled subaqueous bottomlands if the applicant can provide evidence that such fill was lawfully deposited. The bill also removes the requirement that grantees compensate the Commonwealth in an amount equivalent to 25 percent of the assessed value of the specified parcel. Grantees will pay a fee to the Commonwealth in an amount reasonably related to the costs to effect the conveyance.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** Right now the Virginia Marine Resources Commission (VMRC) is only processing about 1 or 2 of these types of conveyances each year. It is impossible for the agency to predict, right now, the possible long-range fiscal implications of this bill, since it is impossible to predict whether or not the number of conveyances processed will remain stable or will increase. Any monies that are collected from conveyance actions are deposited into the Waterways Improvement Fund, which is primarily used to support the agency Habitat Management program.
