8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Human Resource Management indicates that information from Anthem and Optima, the primary providers for the state employee health insurance plan and the Local Choice health insurance plan for participating localities, shows that the provisions of this bill will result in an increase in costs. Specifically, the state employee plan will increase by approximately \$5.0 million annually and the Local Choice program will increase by approximately \$1.2 million annually.

Of the \$5.0 million total for the state employee plan, \$2.3 million is the general fund share representing and increase in employer premiums for state agencies funded via the general fund. \$1.9 million is the nongeneral fund share for employer premium increases, \$0.4 million is the state employee premium share, and \$0.4 million is the share that will be paid by retired state employees not yet eligible for Medicare.

The costs listed above are the result of providing coverage for children under seven years of age. Including children seven years or older will increase these costs.
