3. Committee: Prescribing Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV controlled substances

4. Title: Education and Health

5. Summary: Requires any prescriber who prescribes a controlled substance included in Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV of the Drug Control Act to request and review information about that patient from the Prescription Monitoring Program, and to continue to do so at least annually for so long as the prescriber continues to prescribe the controlled substance to the patient.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Prescription Monitoring Program provides online reports for prescribers; therefore the additional reports required by the proposed legislation will not have any impact on agency workload.
