5. Summary: Requires the payment of mandatory restitution to the victim of child pornography in an amount determined by the court.

8. Fiscal Implications: A defendant convicted of a child pornography offense under §18.2-374.1, §18.2-374.1:1, or §18.2-374.3 shall be ordered to pay mandatory restitution to the victim of the offense in an amount to be determined by the court. In 2010, there were 849 total convictions for offenses under §18.2-374.1, §18.2-374.1:1, and §18.2-374.3. Since restitution is paid to the victim, there is no fiscal impact on court operations as result of this bill.
