4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control (ABC); prorated license fees for act of God.

5. Summary: Provides for proration of ABC license taxes for licensees whose place of business is destroyed by an act of God, including but not limited to fire, earthquake, hurricane, or storm. The bill also requires the ABC Board to prescribe the schedule of proration. In addition, the bill establishes requirements for outdoor signage and advertising of alcoholic beverages.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final (Indeterminate – see Item #8)

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill requires the ABC Board to establish a schedule of proration for refunded license taxes to licensees who qualify, if the place of business is destroyed by an act of God, including but not limited to fire, earthquake, hurricane, storm, or similar natural disaster or phenomenon. Any refunds ABC might have to issue as a result of this legislation cannot be predicted.

According to ABC, there is no material fiscal impact to the agency associated with the establishment of requirements for outdoor signage and advertising of alcoholic beverages.
