3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Amend procedure by which Wireless E-911 Services Board distributes Wireless E-911 funds.

5. Summary: The enrolled bill requires the Wireless E-911 Services Board to recalculate the distribution percentage for each public safety answering point annually before the start of each fiscal year based on the cost and call load data from one or more of the previous fiscal years. Currently, the board calculates the distribution formula each October based on the data from the prior year.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: None.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: FINAL.

8. Fiscal Implications: The enrolled bill presents no fiscal impact. Though the bill changes the process of the funding distribution to the localities, it does not change the funding amount to be distributed as it remains at sixty percent of the Wireless Fund.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Local 9-1-1 Centers, Wireless E-911 Services Board.
