3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Aboveground storage tanks; retrofitted tanks; allocation of proceeds from civil penalties.

5. Summary: This bill requires the State Water Control Board to adopt regulations for aboveground storage tanks at facilities with an aggregate capacity of one million gallons or greater existing prior to January 29, 1992, and located in a city surrounded by a county wherein the urban county executive form of government is in effect. The Board is required to establish performance standards for operators to bring aboveground storage tanks into substantial conformance with current regulations for newer tanks. Operators with affected facilities must meet such performance standards no later than July 1, 2021.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Environmental Quality.

8. Fiscal Implications: Workload associated with developing Agency regulations can be done within existing resources. Localities will have compliance or enforcement responsibilities.
