8. Fiscal Implications: Due to the hold harmless provision of § 15.2-1302, paragraph 1. ("...state funds shall not be reduced below the amounts that would have been received by each entity from the Commonwealth for the governmental program or function computed on the premise that no consolidation occurred for a period of twenty fiscal years following the consolidation"), the "599" funding previously identified as a savings (\$238,637) would continue being allocated to the locality, thereby eliminating any previous savings identified with this proposal.

According to the Compensation Board, the sheriff for the City of Alleghany Highlands will be eligible for four additional law enforcement positions at an annual cost of \$135,857 due to this proposed merger. It is not clear, though, given the hold harmless provision noted previously, whether additional funding from the Compensation Board is necessary despite the newly merged locality qualifying for more deputies.
