11200191D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 5050** 1 2 Offered June 9, 2011 3 Celebrating the life of Paul Eulalius Sullivan. 4 Patrons-Surovell; Senator: Puller 5 6 Unanimous consent to introduce 7 8 WHEREAS, Paul Eulalius Sullivan, a retired intelligence analyst and community supporter who 9 brought a groundbreaking civil rights suit to the United States Supreme Court in the 1960s, died on March 14, 2011; and 10 WHEREAS, the son of Irish immigrants, Paul Sullivan spent his youth in Boston, attending an 11 Augustinian Seminary in New York in his late teens before enlisting in the United States Navy and 12 13 proudly serving his country in San Diego during World War II; and WHEREAS, Paul Sullivan attended Georgetown University on the GI Bill, graduating from its 14 15 School of Foreign Service before embarking on a career with the federal government that would span 16 more than three decades; and WHEREAS, a gifted linguist, Paul Sullivan was an intelligence analyst for various agencies, 17 including the National Security Agency and the Defense Intelligence Agency, where he made many 18 19 valuable contributions; and 20 WHEREAS, possessed of a generous and caring heart and strong sense of fairness, Paul Sullivan 21 lived a life marked by service to his country, community, friends, and family; and 22 WHEREAS, in the 1960s, Paul Sullivan owned a rental home in his neighborhood subdivision in the 23 Mount Vernon area of Fairfax County that included use of the community swimming pool; when he 24 leased the house to a United States Department of Agriculture employee and his family who were black, 25 the neighborhood association advised him that the black family could not use the swimming pool; and WHEREAS, a man of great integrity, Paul Sullivan protested the decision and attempted to gather 26 27 support from local neighbors; as a result, he and his family were barred from use of the community 28 swimming pool as well and received numerous threats; and WHEREAS, Paul Sullivan took legal action that eventually resulted in a landmark case before the 29 30 United States Supreme Court in 1969 that was decided in his favor and set a precedent for other 31 neighborhood associations and resulted in the desegregation of hundreds of community pools across the 32 United States: and 33 WHEREAS, throughout his life, Paul Sullivan generously shared his time and resources with those 34 around him, delivering for Meals on Wheels, serving as a Eucharistic Minister at the Alexandria City 35 Jail, tutoring adults for literacy, and preparing and serving meals at St. Joseph Catholic Church; and WHEREAS, as an adult, Paul Sullivan returned to his Irish roots, visiting Ireland and immersing 36 37 himself in the language, becoming proficient enough to teach at Hagerstown Community College; and 38 WHEREAS, dear to Paul Sullivan's heart was his beloved family and friends with whom he 39 cherished spending time; he particularly enjoyed cooking for them as they shared their lives with him; 40 and 41 WHEREAS, predeceased by his children, Sean, Furey, and Brigid, Paul Sullivan will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife of 61 years, Flora; surviving children, Chela, Isa, Maire, 42 Lola, and Monica and their families; and numerous other family members, friends, and admirers; now, 43 44 therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby 45 46 note with great sadness the loss of an admired citizen and outstanding Virginian, Paul Eulalius Sullivan; 47 and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 48 49 for presentation to the family of Paul Eulalius Sullivan as an expression of the General Assembly's 50 respect for his memory.
