3 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 24.2-529 and 24.2-644 of the Code of Virginia, relating to elections 4 and primary ballots. 5

Referred to Committee on Privileges and Elections

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That §§ 24.2-529 and 24.2-644 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 24.2-529. Primary ballots. 11

The primary ballots for the several parties taking part in a primary shall be composed, arranged, 12 printed, delivered, and provided in the same manner as the general election ballots except that at the top 13 of each official primary ballot shall be printed in plain black type the name of the political party and the 14 words "Primary Election." The names of the candidates for various offices shall appear on the ballot in 15 an order determined by the priority of the time of filing for the office. In the event two or more 16 candidates file simultaneously, the order of filing shall then be determined by lot by the electoral board 17 or the State Board as in the case of a tie vote for the office. No write in shall be permitted on ballots in 18 19 primary elections. 20

§ 24.2-644. Voting by paper ballot; voting for presidential electors; write-in votes.

21 A. The qualified voter shall take the official paper ballot and enter the voting booth. After entering 22 the voting booth, the qualified voter shall mark immediately preceding the name of each candidate for 23 whom he wishes to vote a check ($\sqrt{}$) or a cross (X or +) or a line (-) in the square provided for such 24 purpose, leaving unmarked the square preceding the name of each candidate for whom he does not wish 25 to vote. Any ballot marked so that the intent of the voter is clear shall be counted.

B. The qualified voter at a presidential election shall mark the square preceding the names and party 26 27 designation for his choice of candidates for President and Vice President. His ballot so marked shall be 28 counted as if he had marked squares preceding the names of the individual electors affiliated with his 29 choice for President and Vice President. The qualified voter at a presidential election may cast a write-in 30 vote for President and Vice President as provided in subsections C and D of this section.

31 C. At all elections, except primary elections it shall be lawful for any voter to vote for any person other than the listed candidates for the office by writing or hand printing the person's name on the 32 33 official ballot. No check or other mark shall be required to cast a valid write-in vote. Write-in votes for President and Vice President shall be counted only for candidates who have filed a joint declaration of 34 35 intent to be write-in candidates for the offices with the Secretary of the State Board not less than ten 36 days before the date of the presidential election. The declaration of intent shall be on a form prescribed 37 by the State Board and shall include a list of presidential electors pledged to those candidates which 38 equals the whole number of senators and representatives to which the Commonwealth at that time is 39 entitled in the Congress of the United States. A write-in vote cast for candidates for President and Vice 40 President, or for a candidate for President only, shall be counted for the individual electors listed on the 41 declaration of intent as pledged to those candidates.

42 D. No write-in vote shall be counted unless the name is entered on the ballot in conformance with this section. No write-in vote shall be counted when it is apparent to the officers of election that a voter 43 has voted for the same person for the same office more than one time. No write-in vote shall be counted 44 45 for an office for any person whose name appears on the ballot as a candidate for that office. If two or 46 more persons are to be elected to the same office, a voter may vote for one or more persons whose 47 names do appear on the ballot and one or more persons whose names do not appear on the ballot, 48 provided that the total number of votes cast by him for that office does not exceed the number of 49 persons to be elected to that office.
