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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 44-146.15 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12 13	§ 44-146.15. Construction of chapter.
13 14	Nothing in this chapter is to be construed to: (1) Limit, modify, or abridge the authority of the Governor to exercise any powers vested in him
14	under other laws of this Commonwealth independent of, or in conjunction with, any provisions of this
16	chapter;
17	(2) Interfere with dissemination of news or comment on public affairs; but any communications
18	facility or organization, including, but not limited to, radio and television stations, wire services, and
19	newspapers, may be required to transmit or print public service messages furnishing information or
20	instructions in connection with actual or pending disaster;
21	(3) Empower the Governor, any political subdivision, or any other governmental authority to in any
22	way limit or prohibit the rights of the people to keep and bear arms as guaranteed by Article I, Section
23	13 of the Constitution of Virginia or the Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States,
24	including the otherwise lawful possession, carrying, transportation, sale, or transfer of firearms except to
25	the extent necessary to ensure public safety in any place or facility designated or used by the Governor,
26	any political subdivision of the Commonwealth, or any other governmental entity as an emergency
27	shelter or for the purpose of sheltering persons;
28	(4) Affect the jurisdiction or responsibilities of police forces, fire fighting firefighting forces, units of the armed forces of the United States or any percented thereof, when an active duty but state, level and
29 30	the armed forces of the United States or any personnel thereof, when on active duty; but state, local and interjurisdictional agencies for emergency services shall place reliance upon such forces in the event of
30 31	declared disasters; or
32	(5) Interfere with the course of conduct of a labor dispute except that actions otherwise authorized by
33	this chapter or other laws may be taken when necessary to forestall or mitigate imminent or existing
34	danger to public health or safety.

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
