10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 65.2-201 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 65.2-201. General duties and powers of the Commission.
13	A. It shall be the duty of the Commission to administer this title and adjudicate issues and
14	controversies relating thereto. In all matters within the jurisdiction of the Commission, it shall have the
15	power of a court of record to administer oath, to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production
16	of documents, to punish for contempt, to appoint guardians pursuant to Title 31, and to enforce
17	compliance with its lawful orders and awards. The Commission shall make rules and regulations for
18	carrying out the provisions of this title.
19	B. The Commission may appoint deputies, bailiffs, and such other personnel as it may deem
20	necessary for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this title. No person appointed to serve as a
21	deputy commissioner shall continue to serve in such position following the adjournment of the regular
22	session of the General Assembly that convenes following the fifth anniversary of his initial appointment
23 24	unless he is reappointed to such position by the General Assembly during such session; however, any
24 25	person serving as deputy commissioner on January 9, 2013, who has served in such position for longer than five years shall not be eligible to continue to serve in such position after the adjournment of the
23 26	2013 Session of the General Assembly unless he is reappointed to such position by the General
2 7	Assembly during the 2013 Session.
28	C. The Commission or any member thereof or any person deputized by it may for the purposes of
29	this title subpoena witnesses, administer or cause to be administered oaths, and examine or cause to be
30	examined such parts of the books and records of the parties to a proceeding as relate to questions in
31	dispute arising in instances in which the Commission has power to award compensation. This authority
32	shall extend to requests from like agencies of other states who honor similar requests from the
33	Commission.
34	D. The Commission shall publish and, upon request, furnish free of charge, such blank forms and
35 36	literature as it shall deem requisite to facilitate or promote the efficient administration of this title. The Commission shall publish a workers' compensation guide for employees which informs an injured
30 37	employee of his rights under this title. If the Commission receives notice of an accident, it shall provide
38	a workers' compensation guide to the employee.
39	E. The Commission shall tabulate the accident reports received from employers in accordance with
40	§ 65.2-900 and shall publish the same in the annual report of the Commission and as often as it may
41	deem advisable, in such detailed or aggregate form as it may deem best. The name of the employer or
42	employee shall not appear in such publications, and the employers' reports shall be private records of the
43	Commission and shall not be open for public inspection except for the inspection by the parties directly
44	involved, and only to the extent of such interest. These reports shall not be used as evidence against any
45	employer in any suit at law brought by any employee for the recovery of damages.

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
