[HB 985]) A BILL to amend and reenact § 54.1-4009 of the Code of Virginia, relating to pawnbrokers; records 6 7 required to be maintained; digital images. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 8 9 1. That § 54.1-4009 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 54.1-4009. Records to be kept; credentials of person pawning goods; fee; penalty. 11 A. Every pawnbroker shall keep at his place of business an accurate and legible record of each loan 12 or transaction in the course of his business, including transactions in which secondhand goods, wares or merchandise are purchased for resale. The account shall be recorded at the time of the loan or 13 14 transaction and shall include: 15 1. A description, serial number, and a statement of ownership of the goods, article or thing pawned 16 or pledged or received on account of money loaned thereon, or purchased for resale; 17 2. The time, date and place of the transaction; 3. The amount of money loaned thereon at the time of pledging the same or paid as the purchase 18 19 price; 20 4. The rate of interest to be paid on such loan; 21 5. The fees charged by the pawnbroker, itemizing each fee charged; 22 6. The full name, residence address, telephone number, and driver's license number or other form of 23 identification of the person pawning or pledging or selling the goods, article or thing, together with a 24 particular description, including the height, weight, date of birth, race, gender, hair and eye color, and 25 any other identifying marks, of such person; 26 7. Verification of the identification by the exhibition of a government-issued identification card 27 bearing a photograph of the person pawning, pledging or selling the goods, items, or thing, such as a 28 driver's license or military identification card. The record shall contain the type of identification 29 exhibited, the issuing agency, and the number thereon; 30 8. A digital image of (i) the form of identification used by the person involved in the transaction and 31 (ii) the article or thing pawned or pledged or received on account of money loaned; 9. As to loans, the terms and conditions of the loan, including the period for which any such loan 32 33 may be made; and 34 9. 10. All other facts and circumstances respecting such loan or purchase. 35 B. A pawnbroker may maintain at his place of business an electronic record of each transaction 36 involving goods, article or things pawned or pledged or purchased. If maintained electronically, a 37 pawnbroker shall retain the electronic records for at least one year after the date of the transaction and 38 make such electronic records available to any duly authorized law-enforcement officer upon request. 39 C. For each loan or transaction, a pawnbroker may charge a service fee for making the daily 40 electronic reports to the appropriate law-enforcement officers required by § 54.1-4010, creating and maintaining the electronic records required under this section, and investigating the legal title to property 41 42 being pawned or pledged or purchased. Such fee shall not exceed five percent of the amount loaned on such item or paid by the pawnbroker for such item or \$3, whichever is less. Any person, firm, or 43 44 corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor. D. The Superintendent of State Police shall promulgate regulations specifying the nature of the 45 particular description for the purposes of subdivision A 6. 46 The Superintendent of State Police shall promulgate regulations specifying the nature of identifying 47 credentials of the person pawning, pledging or selling the goods. Such credentials shall be examined by **48** 49 the pawnbroker, and an appropriate record retained thereof.

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
