10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 62.1-132.19 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 62.1-132.19. Acquisition and lease of property.
13	A. The Authority is empowered to rent, lease, buy, own, acquire, construct, reconstruct, and, <i>except</i>
14	as provided in subsection D, dispose of harbors, seaports, port facilities, and such property, whether real
15	or personal, as it may find necessary or convenient and issue revenue bonds therefor without pledging
16	the faith and credit of the Commonwealth.
17	B. The Authority may lease to another such part or all of its real or personal property for such
18	period and upon such terms and conditions as the Authority may determine.
19 20	C. The Authority shall neither expend funds nor incur any indebtedness for any improvement, repair, maintenance, or addition to any real or personal property owned by anyone other than the Authority, the
2 0 2 1	Commonwealth, or a political subdivision of the Commonwealth, unless either (i) the use of such
22	property is guaranteed to the Authority or the Commonwealth by a lease extending beyond the useful
23	life of the improvement, repair, maintenance, addition, or new facility, or (ii) such expenditure or
24	indebtedness is approved in writing by the Governor.
25	D. Neither the Commonwealth nor the Authority shall enter into any contract affecting a change in
26	ownership of any Authority seaport without the prior consent of both the Governor and the General
27	Assembly.

28 2. That the Governor shall notify the General Assembly of any unsolicited bid from the private
29 sector to purchase any seaport within 60 days of receipt of such unsolicited bid.
