10 11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 2.2-703.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 2.2-703.1. Strategic long-range planning for aging services; four-year plan; report.
13	A. The Department shall develop and maintain a four-year plan for aging services in the
14	Commonwealth. Such plan shall serve to inform the State Plan for Aging Services as required by the
15	federal Administration on Aging. In developing the plan, the Department shall consult (i) various state
16	and local services agencies, (ii) businesses, (iii) nonprofit organizations, (iv) advocacy organizations, (v)
17	universities, (vi) providers, (vii) organizations involved in providing services for and advocating for
18	older Virginians and their caregivers, and (viii) stakeholders, including but not limited to, Virginia's
19	Area Agencies on Aging; the state's health and human resources agencies, boards, councils, and
20	commissions; the Departments of Transportation, Rail and Public Transportation, Housing and
21	Community Development, and Corrections; and Virginia Housing Development Authority.
22 23	In addition, the plan shall inform and serve as a resource to a long-term blueprint for state and community planning for aging populations that shall be comprehensive and not limited to traditional
23 24	health and human services issues, but rather consists of broad-based issues of active daily life in
25	communities throughout the Commonwealth.
26	B. The four-year plan shall include:
27	1. A description of Virginia's aging population and its impact on the Commonwealth, and issues
28	related to ensuring and providing services to this population at both the state and local level;
29	2. Factors for the Department to consider in determining when additional funding may be required
30	for certain programs or services;
31	3. Information on changes in the aging populations, with particular attention on the growing diversity
32	of the population including low-income, minority, and non-English speaking older Virginians;
33 34	4. Information on unmet needs and waiting list data for aging-related services as reported by
3 <del>4</del> 35	Virginia's Area Agencies on Aging and those state agencies that may maintain and provide this information;
36	5. Results from periodic needs surveys and customer satisfaction surveys targeted to older Virginians
37	that may be conducted by the Department, the Area Agencies on Aging, or any other state or local
38	agency from time to time;
39	6. An analysis by every state agency of how the aging of the population impacts their agency, its
40	services, and how the agency is responding to this impact. Such analysis shall be provided to the
41	Department every four years on a schedule and in a format determined by the Secretary of Health and
42	Human Resources in coordination with the Department;
43 44	<ul><li>7. The impact of changes in federal and state funding for aging services;</li><li>8. The current status and future development of Virginia's No Wrong Door Initiative; and</li></ul>
45	9. Any other factors the Department deems appropriate.
46	C. In carrying out the duties provided by this section, the Commissioner shall submit the plan to the
47	Governor and the General Assembly by June 30, 2013 October 1, 2015. Thereafter, the plan shall be
48	submitted every four years.
49	D. The Commissioner shall also submit an update of the current plan by October 1, 2011 2013, to
50	the Governor and the General Assembly on the status and sufficiency of aging services and supports in
51	the Commonwealth.
