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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 23-9.2:10 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 23-9.2:10. Violence prevention committee; threat assessment team.
13	A. Each public college or university shall have in place policies and procedures for the prevention of
14	violence on campus, including, to the extent resources are available, assessment and intervention with
15	individuals whose behavior poses a threat to the safety of the campus community.
16	B. The board of visitors or other governing body of each public institution of higher education shall
17	determine a committee structure on campus of individuals charged with education and prevention of
18	violence on campus. Each committee shall include, to the extent such persons are available,
19	representatives from student affairs, law enforcement, human resources, counseling services, residence
20	life, and other constituencies as needed. Such committee shall also consult with legal counsel as needed.
21	Once formed, each committee shall develop a clear statement of: (i) mission, (ii) membership, and (iii)
22	leadership. Such statement shall be published and available to the campus community.
23	C. Each committee shall be charged with: (i) providing guidance to students, faculty, and staff
24	regarding recognition of threatening or aberrant behavior that may represent a threat to the community;
25 26	(ii) identification of <i>identifying</i> members of the campus community to whom threatening behavior should
20 27	be reported; and (iii) <i>developing, as resources become available,</i> policies and procedures for the assessment of individuals whose behavior may present a threat, appropriate means of intervention with
² / ₂₈	such individuals, and sufficient means of action, including interim suspension or medical separation to
2 9	resolve potential threats.
30	D. The board of visitors or other governing body of each public institution of higher education shall
31	establish a specific threat assessment team that shall include, to the extent such persons are available,
32	members from law enforcement, mental health professionals, representatives of student affairs and
33	human resources, and, if available, college or university counsel. Such team shall implement the
34	assessment, intervention and action policies set forth by the committee pursuant to subsection C.
35	E. Each threat assessment team shall establish relationships or utilize existing relationships with local
36	and state law-enforcement agencies as well as mental health agencies to, within the capability of such
37	agencies, expedite assessment and intervention with individuals whose behavior may present a threat to
38	safety. Upon a preliminary determination that an individual poses a threat of violence to self or others,
39	or exhibits significantly disruptive behavior or need for assistance, a threat assessment team may obtain
40	criminal history record information, as provided in §§ 19.2-389 and 19.2-389.1, and health records, as
41	provided in § 32.1-127.1:03. No member of a threat assessment team shall redisclose any criminal
42	history record information or health information obtained pursuant to this section or otherwise use any
43	record of an individual beyond the purpose for which such disclosure was made to the threat assessment
44	team.

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
