10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 18.2-323.03 as follows:
12	§ 18.2-323.03. Failure to report death of child or missing child by parent, guardian, etc.; penalty.
13	A. Any parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a child or a person standing in loco parentis to a
14	child who, with intent to conceal the death, fails to report or cause to be reported the death of the child
15	not in the care of a health care provider to the local law-enforcement agency, the State Police, or an
16	emergency health care provider within one hour of his discovery of the death is guilty of a Class 6
17	felony.
18	B. Any parent, guardian, or legal custodian of a missing child or a person standing in loco parentis
19	to a missing child who, with intent to conceal the fact that the child is missing, fails to report or cause
20	to be reported to the local law-enforcement agency or the State Police that the child is missing within
21	24 hours of his discovery of the fact is guilty of a Class 6 felony.
22	2. That the provisions of this act may result in a net increase in periods of imprisonment or
23	commitment. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the necessary appropriation cannot
24	be determined for periods of imprisonment in state adult correctional facilities; therefore, Chapter
25	874 of the Acts of Assembly of 2010 requires the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission to
26	assign a minimum fiscal impact of \$50,000. Pursuant to § 30-19.1:4, the estimated amount of the
27	necessary appropriation cannot be determined for periods of commitment to the custody of the
28	Department of Juvenile Justice.
