10	WHEREAS, since Colonial times, cider has played an important role in the cultural and culinary
11	heritage of the Commonwealth and nation; and
12	WHEREAS, early settlers planted orchards and fermented the juice from the apples, yielding a
13 14	beverage that provided essential vitamins and nutrients during lean winters, while vinegar, made from
14	the cider, was used for antiseptic and medicinal purposes; and WHEREAS, Thomas Jefferson, at his beloved Monticello in Virginia's beautiful Piedmont region,
13 16	planted two orchards specifically for cider production, sharing the hearty beverage with his family and
17	many guests; and
18	WHEREAS, as settlers planted seedling orchards, they developed new varieties of apples that were
19	particularly well suited to the climate and soils of the new land, many of which continue to be grown
20	today; and
21	WHEREAS, over time, as the nation shifted from an agrarian to industrial society, and with the
22	advent of Prohibition, the number of orchards producing apples for cider and cider production
23	diminished; and
24	WHEREAS, over the past several years, cider production has experienced a resurgence, with five
25	hard cider producers currently operating in the Commonwealth and more expected to open in 2012; and
26	WHEREAS, the cider industry enhances the preservation of agricultural lands, contributes to the
27	Commonwealth's agricultural industry, provides additional opportunities for agritourism, and encourages
28 29	individuals to enjoy a traditional Virginia beverage; and WHEREAS Virginia eider corres as an excellent complement to many quisines, especially these
29 30	WHEREAS, Virginia cider serves as an excellent complement to many cuisines, especially those traditional dishes commonly enjoyed during the holiday season; now, therefore, be it
30 31	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly designate
32	the full week before Thanksgiving, in 2012 and in each succeeding year, as Virginia Cider Week in
33	Virginia; and, be it
