12104004D **HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 222** 1 2 Offered January 19, 2012 3 Commending the Town of Boydton on the occasion of its 200th anniversary. 4 Patrons-Wright; Senator: Ruff 5 6 WHEREAS, Mecklenburg County's seat of government from the county's founding in 1765 was 7 known originally as Mecklenburg Courthouse; and 8 WHEREAS, in 1812 the General Assembly established a town at this location named Boyd Town; 9 and WHEREAS, the name was derived from Alexander Boyd the Younger, who deeded 50 acres of land 10 surrounding the courthouse and jail, previously owned by his grandfather, Richard Swepson, to create 11 the town, which later changed its name to Boydton; and 12 WHEREAS, the principal streets were named for the earliest presidents of the United States who 13 14 were native Virginians, and the remaining streets were named for prominent military leaders at the time 15 of the impending War of 1812; and WHEREAS, the Town of Boydton's dominant role throughout its 200-year history has been that of 16 17 county capital; and WHEREAS, Boydton is noted for its many examples of distinguished public buildings and private 18 19 residences in various architectural styles, capped by the county courthouse modeled on the Thomas 20 Jefferson-designed State Capitol; and 21 WHEREAS, the Methodists of Virginia and North Carolina established Randolph-Macon College at 22 Boydton in 1830, which is the oldest continuous Methodist-related college in the United States; and 23 WHEREAS, Virginia's first regional public library, the Southside Regional Library, is headquartered 24 at Boydton, originating as a gift of Ambassador David K.E. Bruce and Alisa Mellon Bruce in 1938; and WHEREAS, numerous persons prominent in public life, theology, education, medicine, law, 25 literature, and other professions, arts, and trades over the past 200 years have called Boydton home; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Boydton is the closest town to John H. Kerr Dam and Reservoir, one of the nation's 28 larger hydroelectric and flood control projects, which attracts thousands annually to its recreational 29 facilities; and 30 WHEREAS, Boydton received national recognition on the occasion of its first annual Boydton Day 31 Festival in 1977 by U.S. News & World Report as "A Small Town That Refuses to Die"; and WHEREAS, Boydton was featured in 2010 on the NBC television program Who Do You Think You 32 33 Are? which explored the ancestral search of National Football League Hall of Famer Emmitt Smith; and WHEREAS, a significant advance in Boydton's 200 years of progress, highlighted by its rich heritage, varied resources, and friendly citizens, came in 2010 with Microsoft Corporation's decision to 34 35 36 locate at Boydton one of the nation's most advanced cloud computing data centers, representing the 37 largest financial investment ever made in Southside Virginia; and WHEREAS, the Town of Boydton is celebrating its bicentennial with a year-long series of events 38 39 designed to honor the past and promote its future; now, therefore, be it 40 RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the General Assembly hereby 41 commend the Town of Boydton on the occasion of its 200th anniversary; and, be it RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the House of Delegates prepare a copy of this resolution 42 for presentation to Gerald W. Wrenn, Mayor of the Town of Boydton, as an expression of the General 43 Assembly's congratulations and admiration for the Town's rich history and its citizens' contributions to 44 45 the Commonwealth.
