WHEREAS, Eunice Terry enjoyed her membership in the Iota Phi Lambda Sorority; she stayed active in her leisure time playing pinochle and bridge; she was a member of the Tidewater Bridge Association; and

WHEREAS, Eunice Terry leaves to cherish her memory, her husband of 64 years, Thomas R. Terry, Sr.; her son, Thomas R. Terry, Jr., and his family; and many other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of a devoted wife and mother who worked to make her community a better place, Eunice White Terry; and, be it
