WHEREAS, as part of the meeting marking Hugh Rosser's retirement, staff members distributed a booklet of especially memorable sayings and quotations made by Hugh Rosser during his tenure on the board of supervisors, urging the recipients to refer to it often when they sought advice and guidance; and

WHEREAS, throughout his half-century of public service and as a strong business leader in the community, Hugh Rosser's primary goal was to serve Campbell County's residents while laying the groundwork for a future of economic well-being; now, therefore, be it
