10	WHEREAS, a value-added tax (VAT) is a consumption tax placed on products whenever value is
11	added and at final sale, typically with credits, complex recordkeeping, and varying rates for different
12	products; and
13	WHEREAS, the VAT would be another new tax that American families and small businesses would
14	bear; and
15	WHEREAS, the typical VAT rate in Europe has grown from less than five percent in the 1960s to
16	nearly 20 percent today; and
17	WHEREAS, the minimum VAT rate a country needs to join the European Union is 15 percent; and
18	WHEREAS, other taxes in Europe have risen at the same time as the VAT has risen, leading to a
19	very high level of taxation compared with the United States; and
20	WHEREAS, there is every reason to believe that the European experience of the last half-century
21	would be repeated here; and
22	WHEREAS, there are pro-growth ways to promote domestic manufacturing and international tax
23	competitiveness without imposing a dangerous new VAT on top of existing income taxes; and
24	WHEREAS, there are pro-growth and pro-business ways of executing tax reform that do not involve
25	the introduction of a new type of tax into our tax structure on top of, or in addition to, existing income
26	and other taxes; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring. That the members of the Virginia
