That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 23-7.4:7 as follows: 11 12 § 23-7.4:7. Partial tuition waiver for dependent children of university and college faculty. 13 A. There is hereby created the Dependent Children of University and College Faculty Reduced 14 Tuition Program, to be administered by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia. Under this 15 program, dependent children of current full-time faculty members who have been employed full time by 16 any one or more public Virginia universities or colleges for an aggregate period of at least seven years shall receive a 50 percent tuition waiver. The tuition waivers shall be used for undergraduate education 17 at any public institution of higher education in Virginia. The State Council of Higher Education for 18 19 Virginia shall promulgate regulations for the implementation of the provisions of this section and the 20 disbursement of funds consistent therewith and appropriate to the administration of the program. 21 B. To be eligible for the partial tuition waiver under this program, the dependent child must be 22 under the age of 21 at the commencement of the academic year during which the initial tuition waiver 23 is to be effective and either have been admitted to a public Virginia university or college under the 24 same admissions requirements, standards, and policies applicable to other applicants of the same 25 university or college or be a current student in good standing at a public Virginia university or college. C. An eligible applicant who has continued to maintain satisfactory academic progress toward 26 27 graduation may have his partial tuition waiver renewed until (i) he has accumulated a maximum of 120 28 academic credit hours or (ii) he reaches his 25th birthday, whichever occurs first. 29 D. No partial tuition waiver allocated under this program shall be charged against any other tuition 30 waiver limitation established by the Commonwealth. 31 E. This partial tuition waiver shall not apply to students enrolled under the academic common 32 market agreement. 33 F. From such funds as may be appropriated for this purpose and from such gifts, grants, donations, 34 bequests, and other funds as may be received on its behalf, there is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Dependent Children of University and College Faculty Reduced Tuition Fund, hereafter referred to as "the Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books 35 36 37 of the Comptroller. Interest earned on moneys in the Fund shall remain in the Fund and be credited to 38 it. Any moneys remaining in the Fund, including interest thereon, at the end of each fiscal year shall 39 not revert to the general fund but shall remain in the Fund. Funds may be paid to any public Virginia 40 university or college on behalf of students who have been awarded tuition waivers under this section. 41 Expenditures and disbursements from the Fund shall be made by the State Treasurer on warrants issued by the Comptroller upon written request signed by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia. 42
