INTRODUCED

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59 The following activities shall be permissible:

60 1. Dental assistants or dental hygienists aiding or assisting licensed dentists, or dental assistants 61 aiding or assisting dental hygienists under the general supervision of a dentist in accordance with 62 regulations promulgated pursuant to § 54.1-2729.01;

63 2. The performance of mechanical work on inanimate objects only, for licensed dentists, by any 64 person employed in or operating a dental laboratory;

65 3. Dental students who are enrolled in accredited D.D.S. or D.M.D. degree programs performing 66 dental operations, under the direction of competent instructors (i) within a dental school or college, dental department of a university or college, or other dental facility within a university or college that is 67 accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; (ii) in a 68 dental clinic operated by a nonprofit organization providing indigent care; (iii) in governmental or 69 70 indigent care clinics in which the student is assigned to practice during his final academic year rotations; 71 (iv) in a private dental office for a limited time during the student's final academic year when under the direct tutorial supervision of a licensed dentist holding appointment on the dental faculty of the school 72 in which the student is enrolled; or (v) practicing dental hygiene in a private dental office under the 73 74 direct supervision of a licensed dentist holding appointment on the dental faculty of the school in which 75 the student is enrolled;

76 4. A licensed dentist from another state or country appearing as a clinician for demonstrating 77 technical procedures before a dental society or organization, convention, or dental college, or performing 78 his duties in connection with a specific case on which he may have been called to the Commonwealth; 79 and

80 5. Dental hygiene students enrolled in an accredited dental hygiene program performing dental 81 hygiene practices as a requisite of the program, under the direction of competent instructors, as defined by regulations of the Board of Dentistry, (i) within a dental hygiene program in a dental school or 82 83 college, or department thereof, or other dental facility within a university or college that is accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education; (ii) in a dental clinic 84 85 operated by a nonprofit organization providing indigent care; (iii) in a governmental or indigent care clinic in which the student is assigned to practice during his final academic year rotations; or (iv) in a 86 87 private dental office for a limited time during the student's final academic year when under the direct 88 supervision of a licensed dentist or licensed dental hygienist holding appointment on the dental faculty 89 of the school in which the student is enrolled; and

90 6. A graduate of an accredited dental program or a graduate of an accredited dental hygiene 91 program engaging in clinical practice under the supervision of a licensed faculty member, but only 92 while participating in a continuing education course offered by a dental program or dental hygiene 93 program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association. 94

§ 54.1-2713. Licenses to teach dentistry; renewals.

95 A. Upon payment of the prescribed fee and provided that no grounds exist to deny licensure pursuant to § 54.1-2706, the Board shall may grant, without examination, a faculty license to teach 96 dentistry in a dental program accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American 97 98 Dental Association to any applicant who (i) is meets one of the following qualifications:

99 1. Is a graduate of a dental school or college or the dental department of a college or university 100 approved by the Board of Dentistry; (ii) has a D.D.S. or D.M.D. degree and is otherwise qualified; (iii) 101 is not, has a current unrestricted license to practice dentistry in at least one other United States jurisdiction, and has never been licensed to practice dentistry in the Commonwealth; (iv) has not failed 102 an examination for a license to practice dentistry in Virginia; and (v) has a license to practice dentistry 103 in at least one other state. The applicant shall also be certified to be on the faculty of an accredited 104 program that teaches dentistry or 105

2. Is a graduate of a dental school or college or the dental department of a college or university, 106 107 has completed an advanced dental education program accredited by the Commission on Dental 108 Accreditation of the American Dental Association, and has never been licensed to practice dentistry in 109 the Commonwealth.

110 B. The dean or program director of the accredited dental program shall provide to the Board 111 verification that the applicant is being hired by the program and shall include an assessment of the 112 applicant's clinical competency and clinical experience that qualifies the applicant for a faculty license.

113 C. The holder of such a license issued pursuant to this section shall be entitled to perform all operations which activities that a person licensed to practice dentistry would be entitled to perform but 114 115 only for the express purpose of teaching. This license does not entitle the holder to practice dentistry intramurally or privately or to receive fees for service and that are part of his faculty duties, including 116 all patient care activities associated with teaching, research, and the delivery of patient care, which take 117 place only within educational facilities owned or operated by or affiliated with the dental school or 118 119 program. A licensee who is qualified based on educational requirements for a specialty board 120 certification shall only practice in the specialty for which he is qualified. A license issued pursuant to

this section shall not authorize the holder to practice dentistry in nonaffiliated clinics or in privatepractice settings.

D. Any license issued under this section shall expire on the June 30 of the second year after its
 issuance or shall terminate when the licensee leaves employment at the accredited dental program. Such
 license may be renewed annually thereafter as long as the accredited program certifies to the licensee's
 continuing employment.

§ 54.1-2714. Restricted licenses to teach dentistry for foreign dentists.

A. The Board may grant, without examination, a restricted license *for a temporary appointment* to teach dentistry at a dental school in this Commonwealth to any person who:

130 1. Is a resident of a foreign country;

- 131 2. Is licensed to practice dentistry in a foreign country;
- **132** 3. Holds a faculty appointment in a dental school in a foreign country;

4. Is a graduate of a foreign dental school or college or the dental department of a foreign college or university;

- 5. Is not licensed to practice dentistry in Virginia;
- 136 6. Has not failed an examination for a license to practice dentistry in this Commonwealth;

137 7. Has received a temporary appointment to the faculty of a dental school in this Commonwealth to138 teach dentistry;

139 8. Is, in the opinion of the Board, qualified to teach dentistry; and

9. Submits a completed application, the supporting documents the Board deems necessary todetermine his qualifications, and the prescribed fee.

B. A restricted license shall entitle the licensee to perform all operations which a person licensed to
practice dentistry may perform but only for the purpose of teaching. No person granted a restricted
license shall practice dentistry intramurally or privately or receive fees for his services.

145 C. A restricted license granted pursuant to this section shall expire twelve 24 months from the date 146 of issuance and may not be renewed or reissued.

147 § 54.1-2725. Faculty licenses to teach dental hygiene; renewals.

148 A. Upon payment of the prescribed fee, the Board shall grant, without examination, a license to teach 149 dental hygiene to any applicant who (i) is a graduate of a dental hygiene school or college or the dental 150 hygiene department of a college or university approved by the Board of Dentistry accredited by the 151 Commission of Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association; (ii) has a B.S., B.A., A.B., or 152 M.S. degree and is otherwise qualified; (iii) is not licensed to practice dental hygiene; and (iv) has not 153 failed an examination for a license to practice dental hygiene in this Commonwealth; and (v) has a 154 license to practice dental hygiene in at least one other state United States jurisdiction. The applicant 155 shall be certified to be on the faculty of an approved institution that teaches dentistry or dental hygiene.

B. The dean or program director of the accredited dental hygiene program shall provide to the
Board verification that the applicant is being hired by the program and shall include an assessment of
the applicant's clinical competency and clinical experience that qualifies the applicant for a faculty
license.

160 C. The holder of such a license issued pursuant to this section shall be entitled to perform all 161 operations which activities that a person licensed to practice dental hygiene would be entitled to perform but only for the express purpose of teaching. This that are part of his faculty duties, including all 162 163 patient care activities associated with teaching, research, and the delivery of patient care that take place 164 only within educational facilities owned or operated by or affiliated with the dental school or program. 165 A license issued pursuant to this section does not entitle the holder to practice dental hygiene intramurally or privately or to receive fees for services in nonaffiliated clinics or other private practice 166 167 settings.

168 D. Any license issued under this section shall expire on the second June 30 of the second year after
 169 its issuance but may be renewed or shall terminate when the licensee leaves employment at the
 170 accredited dental program. Such license may be renewed annually thereafter as long as the accredited
 171 program certifies to the licensee's continuing employment.
