9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 54.1-3931 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 54.1-3931. Granting certificates without examination; law professors.
13	The Supreme Court shall have discretion to grant a certificate without examination to any attorney
14	who has been admitted to practice law before the court of last resort of any state or territory of the
15	United States or the District of Columbia for at least five years. The certificate shall entitle the holder,
16	after paying his license tax, to practice in the courts of this Commonwealth.
17	The Supreme Court shall also have discretion to grant a certificate without examination to any person
18	connected with any foreign embassy or legation to appear in the courts of this Commonwealth in all
19	matters connected with his official duties, provided that the person has been admitted to practice in the
20	court of last resort of the jurisdiction of the embassy or legation to which he is attached or he has
21	received a degree from a law school approved by the American Bar Association.
22	The Supreme Court shall have the authority to promulgate rules and regulations allowing professors
23	in law schools located in the Commonwealth, which that are accredited by the American Bar
24	Association, to become members of the Virginia State Bar, limited to associate membership; however, a
25	professor who has been engaged in the full-time practice of law for five of the seven years immediately
26	preceding his application for membership to the Virginia State Bar, who, at the time of his application,
27	is employed as a full-time professor at an American Bar Association accredited Virginia law school, and
28	who meets all other requirements for admission to the Virginia State Bar may be admitted as an active
29	member, limited to the period of his employment as a full-time professor at such law school.
30	The Supreme Court may authorize the Board or any committee thereof to administer the provisions

of this section.
All other persons shall take the examinations and comply with the applicable provisions of this chapter.
