Celebrating the life of Orlin L. Oatman.

WHEREAS, Pat Oatman continued to serve his fellow veterans over the course of his life as a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars No. 9808 and as past commander of American Legion Post 175; and

WHEREAS, as a member of the Hanover Ruritan Club, Pat Oatman looked for ways to be of service to the community and participated in the club's many activities; and

WHEREAS, Pat Oatman worshipped at Walnut Grove Baptist Church, where he served as director of the men's department and enjoyed fellowship with other members; and

WHEREAS, a man of integrity, Pat Oatman served his country, community, and family with great enthusiasm and commitment; and

WHEREAS, predeceased by his daughter, Bettie, Pat Oatman will be fondly remembered and greatly missed by his wife, Mildred; surviving daughters, Aimee, Peggy, and Terry, and their families; and numerous other family members and friends; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby note with great sadness the loss of a respected citizen of the Commonwealth, Orlin L. Oatman; and, be it
