5 6 WHEREAS, United States Marine Corps Captain Michael M. Quin of Purcellville died in the line of 7 duty on February 22, 2012; and WHEREAS, as a young man, Michael Quin evidenced the strength of character and love of flying 8 9 that would mark his years at the United States Naval Academy and his service in the United States 10 Marine Corps; and WHEREAS, Michael Quin grew up in Easton, Pennsylvania, became an Eagle Scout, played varsity 11 soccer, belonged to the track and field team, and was a member of the National Honor Society; and 12 13 WHEREAS, during his sophomore year of high school, Michael Quin's family moved to Purcellville, where he continued to excel in all of his endeavors at Loudoun Valley High School and made many 14 15 new friends; and 16 WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, Michael Quin watched as the nation came under attack; his resolve and determination to be of service to his country culminated in his mailing his application to the 17 18 United States Naval Academy that same day; and 19 WHEREAS, after graduating from the United States Naval Academy, Michael Quin attended flight school and was "winged" as a naval aviator, fulfilling a lifelong dream; and WHEREAS, a member of Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron, HMLA 469, based at Camp 20 21 Pendleton, California, Captain Quin was to be deployed to Afghanistan in the spring; and 22 WHEREAS, an exemplary Marine who embodied the highest traditions of the Corps, Captain Quin 23 24 led by example and earned the respect of his fellow Marines for his loyalty and commitment to his 25 country; and 26 WHEREAS, Captain Quin's death is a reminder of the perils faced daily by the thousands of 27 Americans who serve in our armed forces and whose devotion to duty places them in harm's way; and 28 WHEREAS, Michael Quin will be greatly missed by his parents, Bradley and Betsy; fiancée, Kate; 29 siblings, Phoebe and Sarah; numerous other family members and friends; and fellow Marines; now, 30 therefore, be it 31 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby
