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10	WHEREAS, the month of April has been designated "National Child Abuse Prevention Month" as an
11	annual observance initiated in 1979 by President Jimmy Carter; and
12	WHEREAS, Shaken Baby Syndrome or abusive head trauma, a form of inflicted head trauma
13	occurring when a child is vigorously shaken, is the leading cause of death in child abuse cases in the
14	United States; and
15	WHEREAS, 80 percent of children who survive serious injuries associated with Shaken Baby
16	Syndrome or abusive head trauma will suffer permanent disability and many will require expensive
17	long-term health care and other services; and
18	WHEREAS, Shaken Baby Syndrome may result in more than \$1,000,000 in medical costs to care for
19	a single, disabled child in just the first few years of life; and
20	WHEREAS, the vast majority of victims of Shaken Baby Syndrome or abusive head trauma are
21	infants younger than one year old; and
22	WHEREAS, the perpetrators in these cases of Shaken Baby Syndrome or abusive head trauma are
23	most often parents or caregivers, most frequently male parents or caregivers; and
24	WHEREAS, caregiver frustration related to a baby's inconsolable crying is often the trigger that
25	results in shaking the baby; and
26 27	WHEREAS, prevention programs that teach new parents about infant crying being normal and
28 28	beneficial and about the dangers associated with shaking a baby can be effective in preventing the number of cases of Shaken Baby Syndrome and thereby prevent enormous medical and disability costs
<u>2</u> 9	and immeasurable grief for many families; and
30	WHEREAS, efforts to prevent Shaken Baby Syndrome are supported by advocacy groups in Virginia
31	and across the United States that were formed by parents and relatives of children who have been killed
32	or injured by shaking, including Shaken Baby Syndrome of Virginia, the National Shaken Baby
33	Coalition, the Shaken Baby Association, the SKIPPER Initiative, the Sarah Jane Brain Foundation, and
34	many other organizations; and
35	WHEREAS, awareness, education, and training for parents and caregivers can reduce the risk that a
36	child will be shaken and that a child will suffer injuries associated with Shaken Baby Syndrome or
37	abusive head trauma; now, therefore, be it
38	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly designate
39	the third week in April, in 2013 and in each succeeding year, as Shaken Baby Syndrome Awareness
40	Week in Virginia in honor of Jared Nicholas Patton and all the many other victims of Shaken Baby
41	Syndrome in Virginia; and, be it
42	RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate post the designation of this week on the
43	General Assembly's website.
