4. Title: Driver's licenses; required to show street address of licensee's principal residence in State.

5. Summary: This bill requires that driver's licenses show the street address of the licensee's principal residence in Virginia.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Motor Vehicles will incur a one-time cost estimated at \$18,600 for initial programming to implement this legislation. It is anticipated that the agency can absorb this within existing resources.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Department of Motor Vehicles; also citizens with various protective order requirements, professionals (such as judges) which require greater privacy and victims of identity theft would be impacted since they use mailing addresses in lieu of street addresses. In addition, military personnel with APO and FPO addresses would be impacted since their address does not qualify as a street address.

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No.

11. Other Comments: Currently, a driver has the option of displaying a post office box, business address, or residential address on the driver's license. No matter which address is shown on the license, the Department of Motor Vehicles maintains the driver's residential address within agency records, viewable by law enforcement.
