4. Title: Driver's licenses; allows military veterans who are at least 21 to have veteran status indicated.

5. Summary: This bill allows military veterans who are at least 21 years old to have their veteran status indicated on their driver's licenses.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Motor Vehicles' cost to add an indicator of veteran status to the license will be a one-time cost of \$101,269. The system changes would be made late in FY 2012 in preparation for FY 2013 implementation. This amount could be provided from the agency's existing resources.

The Department of Motor Vehicles and the Department of Veterans Services have been working together over the past year to develop such a stand-alone, separate veteran's special identification card, and are now close to being able to provide this service to veterans.

11. Other Comments: This bill is similar to HB388, HB568, and HB1025.
