4. Title: Requires two members of the Board of Medical Assistance Services to be fraud investigators

5. Summary: The bill requires that at least two members of the Board of Medical Assistance Services be individuals with significant professional experience in the detection, investigation, or prosecution of health care fraud.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. No Fiscal Impact

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill simply provides that two of the members of the board shall be individuals with experience dealing with fraud. The board has eleven members of whom five are health care providers and six are not. This bill designates two of the six that are not health care providers. Since the bill does not expand the board, there is no fiscal impact.
