- **8. Fiscal Implications:** There would be minimal fiscal impact for the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). VDH has applied for grant funding to develop a Critical Congenital Heart Disease Demonstration Program Plan through the federal Critical Congenital Heart Disease Screening (CCHD) grant. If VDH is not awarded the CCHD Screening grant, which would involve developing a CCHD Plan (called a demonstration pilot in the grant), then existing staff will develop the plan within the current Virginia Genetics Advisory Committee. A separate subcommittee on the current Virginia Genetics Advisory Committee would bring together stakeholders, as identified in the bill, to provide input and guidance on a statewide plan. The administrative costs could be absorbed in the current personnel budget.
