### 3. Committee: House Courts of Justice

- **4. Title:** DUI manslaughter
- 5. Summary:

Under current law, unintentionally causing the death of another person as a result of DUI is considered involuntary manslaughter, a Class 5 felony. A person convicted of a Class 5 felony is subject to a sentence of up to twelve months in jail or one to ten years in prison. The proposed legislation would impose a one year mandatory minimum sentence for this offense.

If the action of the offender were so gross, wanton, and culpable as to show a reckless disregard of human life, the current law provides that the action shall be regarded as aggravated involuntary manslaughter, punishable by a sentence of one to 20 years in prison, one year of which shall be a mandatory minimum sentence. The proposed legislation would increase this mandatory minimum sentence to five years.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No. The Governor's introduced budget bill includes an appropriation for the anticipated fiscal impact of this legislation. See Item 389.

Pursuant to §30-19.1:4 of the Code of Virginia, the Virginia Criminal Sentencing Commission estimates a fiscal impact of \$201,394 (the highest annual cost over the next six years).
