8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> Most public colleges and universities that enroll active military personnel are aware of the difficulties active military students endure, including registration, and deployment issues, and work to accommodate students to provide access to registration and obtain credits due to situations beyond their control. Recent technologies including online registration assist students' access information and desired courses. Several colleges and universities offer registration on military installations to assist with access, including Virginia State University and Old Dominion University. For these reasons, no fiscal impact on higher education institutions is anticipated from the provisions of this legislation.
9.	Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All state colleges and universities, specifically those located near large military installations, including, but not limited to Old Dominion University, Norfolk State University, Virginia State University, George Mason University, the University of Mary Washington, Richard Bland College and several Virginia Community Colleges, including Northern Virginia, Tidewater, Thomas Nelson, and Germanna. Additionally, the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia for developing the guidelines.
