3. Committee: House Privileges and Elections

4. Title: Senate and House of Delegates Districts; technical adjustments in boundaries.

5. Summary: HB 808 changes district assignments of certain Loudoun County census blocks between Senate Districts 13 and 33 and House of Delegates Districts 10, 32, 33, 67, and 87 in order to follow new precinct boundaries. Both Senate districts remain within two percent deviation and all House of Delegates districts remain within one percent deviation from the respective ideal district populations.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: See Item 8

8. Fiscal Implications: Staff at the State Board of Elections report that the typical bill making technical adjustments to a single district would have a cost up to \$5,000 for re-issuing voter registration cards. The agency reports it can absorb the cost with the existing allocation for redistricting costs. However, there are currently five House and Senate bills amending 15 districts with a cumulative effect of about \$75,000. If several of the bills become law, the agency indicates it would need a budget amendment to cover the costs.
