**4. Title:** Solid waste management plan; optional.

**5. Summary:** This bill makes it optional for a governing body to develop and implement a regional or local solid waste management plan; currently, such plans are mandatory. The bill also adds language to §§ 10.1-1408.1 (ii) and (vi), Code of Virginia, to clarify the subdivisions that do not apply to permit applications in any locality that has not developed or no longer maintains a solid waste management plan pursuant to the option that this bill creates.
