**2. Patron:** Delegate Robert B. Bell

**3. Committee:** Passed Both Houses

**4. Title:** Require public and private college employees to report suspected child abuse

**5. Summary:** This legislation makes it mandatory for any person employed by a public or private higher education institution in the Commonwealth, other than an attorney providing legal counsel, to report suspected abuse or neglect of a child.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Indeterminate. Final (see Section 8)

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There are no costs associated with adding employees of higher education institutions to the list of those required to report suspected child abuse. Given that failure to report within 72 hours results in a fine of not more than \$500, with additional fines ranging from \$100 to \$1,000 for subsequent failures, there is a possibility of additional revenue being generated with more individuals subject to these provisions. Any additional revenue collected will be deposited into the Literary Fund.
