2. Patron: Vogel

3. Committee: House committee assignment pending.

4. Title: Permanent protective orders.

5. Summary: Provides a circuit court jurisdiction to hear petitions to modify, dissolve, or extend a permanent protective order if the circuit court issued the order. The bill requires the court, when a protective order is issued, to enter and transfer identifying information to the Virginia Criminal Information Network (VCIN) system. Circuit court clerks who are not currently using the Statewide Case Management System are not required to make reports directly to VCIN until July 1, 2013. The engrossed proposal permits clerks that do not use the Statewide Case Management System of the Supreme Court that are required to make electronic reports to VCIN, to provide the orders directly to VCIN in an electronic format approved by the Department of State Police.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to the Department of State Police, the proposed legislation will not have a fiscal impact.

According to the Supreme Court of Virginia, the proposal will not have a fiscal impact as it is expected that necessary changes to their automated Case Management system can be accomplished within the scope of current court resources.

According to the Compensation Board, the Virginia Circuit Court Clerks' Association has not indicated concerns of a fiscal impact with the bill in its current form, as amended and reported from the Courts of Justice committee.
