2. Patron: McWaters

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control (ABC); privileges of brewery licensees.

5. Summary: Allows a brewery licensee to sell beer at retail at premises described in the brewery license for on-premises consumption and in closed containers for off-premises consumption. The bill also allows these licensees to offer samples of the brewery's products to individuals visiting the licensed premises, provided that such samples shall be provided only to individuals for consumption on the licensed premises and only to individuals to whom such products may be lawfully sold.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Final (see Item #8)

8. Fiscal Implications: Currently, an on-premise brewery licensee would need an off-premise brewery license to sell in closed containers. This legislation combines on-premise and off-premise privileges which would result in an immaterial loss in revenue of \$2,395, resulting from the elimination of 14 off-premise brewery licenses. Other than the fiscal impact noted above, it is not anticipated that this legislation would have a material fiscal impact on ABC.
