WHEREAS, Freedom High School also sports a marching band that has developed a successful winter drumline and color guard and more than 40 clubs and societies to enrich the student population; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, 2012, Freedom High School will hold its first annual Freedom 5K along with a One Mile Fun Run and Tot Trot focused on "Breaking Free from Bullying"; and

WHEREAS, as it marks its seventh anniversary, Freedom High School looks forward to continuing to provide a positive learning environment in which all students can excel; now, therefore, be it
