5 WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter of The Charmettes, Incorporated, celebrated 20
7 years of service to the local community in 2011; and

8 WHEREAS, The Charmettes, Incorporated, began in 1951 in West Palm Beach, Florida, when
9 Frankie Drayton Thomas and Gwendolyn Baker Rodgers saw the need for young women in the
10 community to come together in fellowship and service to the community; and

11 WHEREAS, the organization grew and developed over the years, with chapters established in 12 Florida, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, and Washington, D.C., to promote the 13 civic and social needs of the localities where members reside and to encourage cancer awareness, 14 education, support, and research; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter of The Charmettes, Incorporated, began when Edna
P. Rodwell brought together a group of 10 women—Lois Cumber, Evelyn Jamison, Margaret Jones,
Marsha Meekins, Etta Caution, Shelia Smith, Sallie Thompson, Delores Tyler, Wilhelmina Williams, and
Audrey Winston—at Fifth Baptist Church in October 1990; and

WHEREAS, in January 1991, The Charmettes, Incorporated, founders, Frankie Drayton Thomas and
Gwendolyn Baker Rodgers, came to Richmond to meet with the women and on March 9, 1991,
representatives from 14 chapters of the organization came to Richmond to support the formation of the
Richmond Metropolitan Chapter; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter sponsors a variety of projects to raise cancer
 awareness; its Cancer Health Forum or Health Fair promotes annual physical examinations and
 preventative testing, in addition to updates on cancer research; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter also has an Adopt-A-Child with Cancer Programthat provides support and encouragement to children with cancer diagnoses and their families; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter's Junior Charmette Program stresses to young girls
 in the community the importance of serving others and provides training and education to help them
 through their teenage years; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter also supports other important initiatives, such as the
 Howard University Cancer Research Center, the American Cancer Society, the Sisters Network, and the
 ASK Pediatric Hematology/Oncology Clinic at the VCU Medical Center; and

WHEREAS, members of the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter enjoy reaching out to one another and
 the community through a host of activities, including a dinner theater, Harvest Ball, Tom Thumb
 Wedding, and cancer benefit musical; and

WHEREAS, the Richmond Metropolitan Chapter of The Charmettes, Incorporated, has made many
contributions to cancer awareness, research, and education and other community projects during its
history and looks forward to continuing to serve the community; now, therefore, be it
