That §§ 54.1-3500, 54.1-3505, and 54.1-3506 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted 10 as follows: 11 § 54.1-3500. Definitions. 12 13 As used in this chapter, unless the context requires a different meaning: "Appraisal activities" means the exercise of professional judgment based on observations and 14 15 objective assessments of a client's behavior to evaluate current functioning, diagnose, and select appropriate treatment required to remediate identified problems or to make appropriate referrals. 16 "Board" means the Board of Counseling. 17 "Certified substance abuse counseling assistant" means a person certified by the Board to practice in 18 19 accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.2. "Certified substance abuse counselor" means a person certified by the Board to practice in 20 21 accordance with the provisions of § 54.1-3507.1. "Counseling" means the therapeutic process of: application of principles, standards, and methods of 22 23 the counseling profession in (i) conducting assessments and diagnoses for the purpose of establishing 24 treatment goals and objectives and (ii) planning, implementing, and evaluating treatment plans using 25 treatment interventions to facilitate human development and to identify and remediate mental, emotional, or behavioral disorders and associated distresses which that interfere with mental health. 26 27 "Counseling treatment intervention" means those cognitive, affective, behavioral and systemic 28 counseling strategies, techniques and methods common to the behavioral sciences that are specifically 29 implemented in the context of a therapeutic relationship. Other treatment interventions include 30 developmental counseling, guidance, and consulting to facilitate normal growth and development, 31 including educational and career development. "Licensed substance abuse treatment practitioner" means a person who: (i) is trained in and engages 32 33 in the practice of substance abuse treatment with individuals or groups of individuals suffering from the effects of substance abuse or dependence, and in the prevention of substance abuse or dependence; and 34 35 (ii) is licensed to provide advanced substance abuse treatment and independent, direct, and unsupervised 36 treatment to such individuals or groups of individuals, and to plan, evaluate, supervise, and direct 37 substance abuse treatment provided by others. 38 "Marriage and family therapist" means a person trained in the assessment and treatment of cognitive, 39 affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques. 40 41 "Marriage and family therapy" means the assessment and treatment of cognitive, affective, or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through 42 the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques and delivery of services to 43 individuals, couples, and families, singularly or in groups, for the purpose of treating such disorders. 44 "Practice of counseling" means rendering or offering to render to individuals, groups, organizations, 45 or the general public any service involving the application of principles, *standards, and* methods or procedures of the counseling profession, which shall include appraisal, counseling, and referral activities. 46 47 "Practice of marriage and family therapy" means the assessment and treatment of cognitive, affective, 48 49 or behavioral mental and emotional disorders within the context of marriage and family systems through 50 the application of therapeutic and family systems theories and techniques, which shall include 51 assessment, treatment, and referral activities. "Practice of substance abuse treatment" means rendering or offering to render substance abuse 52 53 treatment to individuals, groups, organizations, or the general public. "Professional counselor" means a person trained in the application of principles, standards, and 54 methods of the counseling profession, including counseling interventions designed to facilitate an individual's achievement of human development goals and remediating mental, emotional, or behavioral 55 56 disorders and associated distresses which that interfere with mental health and development. 57 58 "Referral activities" means the evaluation of data to identify problems and to determine advisability

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59 of referral to other specialists.

60 "Residency" means a post-internship supervised clinical experience registered with the Board.

61 "Resident" means an individual who has submitted a supervisory contract to the Board and has 62 received Board approval to provide clinical services in professional counseling under supervision.

"Substance abuse" and "substance dependence" mean a maladaptive pattern of substance use leading 63 64 to clinically significant impairment or distress.

65 "Substance abuse treatment" means (i) the application of specific knowledge, skills, substance abuse treatment theory, and substance abuse treatment techniques to define goals and develop a treatment plan 66 of action regarding substance abuse or dependence prevention, education, or treatment in the substance 67 abuse or dependence recovery process and (ii) referrals to medical, social services, psychological, 68 psychiatric, or legal resources when such referrals are indicated. 69

70 "Supervision" means the ongoing process, performed by a supervisor, of monitoring the performance of the person supervised and providing regular, documented individual or group consultation, guidance, 71 and instruction with respect to the clinical skills and competencies of the person supervised. 72 73

§ 54.1-3505. Specific powers and duties of the Board.

74 In addition to the powers granted in § 54.1-2400, the Board shall have the following specific powers 75 and duties:

76 1. To cooperate with and maintain a close liaison with other professional boards and the community 77 to ensure that regulatory systems stay abreast of community and professional needs.

78 2. To conduct inspections to ensure that licensees conduct their practices in a competent manner and 79 in conformance with the relevant regulations. 80

3. To designate specialties within the profession.

4. To administer the certification of rehabilitation providers pursuant to Article 2 (§ 54.1-3510 et 81 82 seq.) of this chapter, including prescribing fees for application processing, examinations, certification and 83 certification renewal. 84

5. [Expired.]

85 6. To promulgate regulations for the qualifications, education, and experience for licensure of marriage and family therapists. The requirements for clinical membership in the American Association 86 for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT), and the professional examination service's national 87 88 marriage and family therapy examination may be considered by the Board in the promulgation of these 89 regulations. The educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour 90 requirements for marriage and family therapists shall not be less than the educational credit hour, 91 clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for professional counselors.

92 7. To promulgate, subject to the requirements of Article 1.1 (§ 54.1-3507 et seq.) of this chapter, regulations for the qualifications, education, and experience for licensure of licensed substance abuse 93 94 treatment practitioners and certification of certified substance abuse counselors and certified substance abuse counseling assistants. The requirements for membership in NAADAC: the Association for 95 Addiction Professionals and its national examination may be considered by the Board in the 96 promulgation of these regulations. The Board also may provide for the consideration and use of the 97 98 accreditation and examination services offered by the Substance Abuse Certification Alliance of Virginia. 99 The educational credit hour, clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for 100 licensed substance abuse treatment practitioners shall not be less than the educational credit hour, 101 clinical experience hour, and clinical supervision hour requirements for licensed professional counselors. 102 Such regulations also shall establish standards and protocols for the clinical supervision of certified 103 substance abuse counselors and the supervision or direction of certified substance abuse counseling assistants, and reasonable access to the persons providing that supervision or direction in settings other 104 105 than a licensed facility.

8. To maintain a registry of persons who meet the requirements for supervision of residents. The 106 107 Board shall make the registry of approved supervisors available to persons seeking residence status. 108 § 54.1-3506. License required.

109 In order to engage in the practice of counseling or marriage and family therapy or in the independent 110 practice of substance abuse treatment, as defined in this chapter, it shall be necessary to hold a license; however, no license shall be required for the practice of marriage and family therapy or the independent 111 practice of substance abuse treatment until six months after the effective date of regulations governing 112 113 marriage and family therapy and substance abuse treatment, respectively, promulgated by the Board 114 under subdivisions 6 and 7 of § 54.1-3505 issued by the Board.

115 [The Board may issue a license as a professional counselor to an applicant who has received a graduate degree from a program in which the primary emphasis is on preparation for the practice of 116 counseling as defined in § 54.1-3500, as explicitly stated in the program curriculum and as evidenced 117 118 by the training and experience of the program faculty.

The Board may issue a license, without examination, for the practice of marriage and family therapy 119 120 or the independent practice of substance abuse treatment to persons who hold a current and unrestricted license as a professional counselor within the Commonwealth and who meet the clinical and academic
requirements for licensure as a marriage and family therapist or licensed substance abuse treatment
practitioner, respectively. The applicant for such license shall present satisfactory evidence of
qualifications equal to those required of applicants for licensure as marriage and family therapists or
licensed substance abuse treatment practitioners, respectively, by examination in the Commonwealth.

Any person who renders substance abuse treatment services as defined in this chapter and who is not licensed to do so, other than a person who is exempt pursuant to § 54.1-3501, shall render such services only when he is (i) under the supervision and direction of a person licensed under this chapter who shall be responsible for the services performed by such unlicensed person, or (ii) in compliance with the regulations governing an organization or a facility licensed by the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services.

132 [2. That persons who have applied to the Board of Counseling for approval of a supervised

133 residency prior to the effective date of this act shall not be subject to the provisions of § 54.1-3506 134 of the Code of Virginia relating to receipt of a graduate program, provided they have completed

135 all coursework and the supervised residence as required by regulations of the Board by July 1, 136 2017.]
