2 *An Act to amend and reenact § 22.1-32 of the Code of Virginia, relating to the date of salary increases*
 3 *for local school board members.*

6 **Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:**7 **1. That § 22.1-32 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:**8 **§ 22.1-32. Salary of members.**

9 A. Any elected school board may pay each of its members an annual salary that is consistent with
 10 the salary procedures and no more than the salary limits provided for local governments in Article 1.1
 11 (§ 15.2-1414.1 et seq.) of Chapter 14 of Title 15.2 or as provided by charter. However, any elected
 12 school board of a school division comprised of a county having the county manager plan of government,
 13 as provided in § 15.2-702.1 may, after a public hearing pursuant to notice in the manner provided in
 14 subdivision 8 of § 22.1-79, set the annual salary of its members at no more than \$25,000, except that
 15 the annual salary of the chairman, vice-chairman, or both, may exceed \$25,000.

16 B. The appointed school board of the following counties may pay each of its members an annual
 17 salary not to exceed the limits hereinafter set forth:

18 Accomack - \$3,000.00;
 19 Alleghany - \$1,500.00;
 20 Amherst - \$2,200.00;
 21 Brunswick - \$1,800.00;
 22 Cumberland - \$3,600.00;
 23 Essex - \$1,800.00;
 24 Greenville - \$1,800.00;
 25 Hanover - \$8,000.00;
 26 Isle of Wight - \$4,000.00;
 27 Northampton - \$3,000.00;
 28 Prince Edward - \$2,400.00;
 29 Richmond - \$5,000.00;
 30 Southampton - \$5,300.00.

31 C. The appointed school board of the following cities and towns may pay each of its members an
 32 annual salary not to exceed the limits hereinafter set forth:

33 Charlottesville - \$3,000.00;
 34 Covington - \$1,500.00;
 35 Danville - \$600.00;
 36 Emporia - \$240.00;
 37 Fries - \$240.00;
 38 Hopewell - \$3,600.00;
 39 Lexington - \$600.00;
 40 Lynchburg - \$2,400.00;
 41 Manassas Park - \$3,000.00;
 42 Martinsville - \$2,400.00;
 43 Norfolk - \$3,000.00;
 44 Poquoson - \$3,000.00;
 45 Roanoke - \$4,200.00;
 46 Salem - \$4,800.00;
 47 South Boston - \$600.00.

48 D. Any school board may, in its discretion, pay the chairman of the school board an additional salary
 49 not exceeding \$2,000 per year upon passage of an appropriate resolution by (i) the school board whose
 50 membership is elected in whole or in part or (ii) the governing body of the appropriate county, city, or
 51 town whose school board is comprised solely of appointed members.

52 E. Any school board may in its discretion pay each of its members mileage for use of a private
 53 vehicle in attending meetings of the school board and in conducting other official business of the school
 54 board. Its members may be reimbursed for private transportation at a rate not to exceed that which is
 55 authorized for persons traveling on state business in accordance with § 2.2-2825. Whatever rate is paid,
 56 however, shall be the same for school board members and employees of the board.

57 F. No appointed school board shall request the General Assembly's consideration of an increase in its
58 annual salary limit as established in subsections B and C ~~of this section~~ unless such school board has
59 taken an affirmative vote on the requested increase. Further, no elected school board shall be awarded a
60 salary increase, unless, upon an affirmative vote by such school board, a specific salary increase shall be
61 approved. Local school boards shall adopt such increases according to the following procedures:

62 1. A local school board representing a county may establish a salary increase prior to July 1 of any
63 year in which members are to be elected or appointed, or, if such school board is elected or appointed
64 for staggered terms, prior to July 1 of any year in which at least 40 percent of such members are to be
65 elected or appointed. However, a school board serving a county having the county manager plan of
66 government and whose membership totals five may establish a salary increase prior to July 1 in any
67 year in which two of the five members are to be elected or appointed. Such increase shall become
68 effective on January 1 of the following year.

69 2. A local school board representing a city or town may establish a salary increase prior to December
70 31 in any year preceding a year in which members are to be elected or appointed. Such increase shall
71 become effective on July 1 of the year in which the election or appointment occurs *if the election or*
72 *appointment occurs prior to July 1 and shall become effective January 1 of the following year if the*
73 *election or appointment occurs after June 30.*

74 No salary increase may become effective during an incumbent member's term of office; however, this
75 restriction shall not apply if the school board members are elected or appointed for staggered terms.
