9 10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 22.1-271.5 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 22.1-271.5. Policies on concussions in student-athletes.
13	A. The Board of Education shall develop and distribute to each local school division guidelines on
14	policies to inform and educate coaches, student-athletes, and their parents or guardians of the nature and
15	risk of concussions, criteria for removal from and return to play, and risks of not reporting the injury
16	and continuing to play.
17	B. Each local school division shall develop policies and procedures regarding the identification and
18	handling of suspected concussions in student-athletes. Such policies shall require:
19	1. In order to participate in any extracurricular physical activity, each student-athlete and the
20	student-athlete's parent or guardian shall review, on an annual basis, information on concussions
21	provided by the local school division. After having reviewed materials describing the short- and
22	long-term health effects of concussions, each student-athlete and the student-athlete's parent or guardian
23	shall sign a statement acknowledging receipt of such information, in a manner approved by the Board of
24	Education; and
25	2. A student-athlete suspected by that student-athlete's coach, athletic trainer, or team physician of
26	sustaining a concussion or brain injury in a practice or game shall be removed from the activity at that
27	time. A student-athlete who has been removed from play, evaluated, and suspected to have a concussion
28 29	or brain injury shall not return to play that same day nor until (i) evaluated by an appropriate licensed
29 30	health care provider as determined by the Board of Education and (ii) in receipt of written clearance to return to play from such licensed health care provider.
30 31	The licensed health care provider evaluating student-athletes suspected of having a concussion or
32	brain injury may be a volunteer.
33	C. In addition, local school divisions may <i>shall</i> provide the guidelines to organizations sponsoring
34	athletic activity for student-athletes on school property. Local school divisions shall not be required to
35	enforce compliance with such policies.
