11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 63.2-608.1 as follows:
13	§ 63.2-608.1. Eligibility for VIEW; screening and assessment for use of illegal substances.
14	As a condition of participation in VIEW, the local director shall screen each participant to determine
15	whether probable cause exists to believe such participant is engaged in the use of illegal substances.
16 17	Such screening shall utilize a standardized screening instrument developed by the Department together with the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services. Screenings shall be performed
18	by a representative of the Department at the time of application and periodically thereafter but not more
19	frequently than every six months. If a screening indicates that there is reason to believe that the VIEW
20	participant is engaged in the use of illegal substances, the Department shall require a formal substance
21	abuse assessment, which may include drug testing to be performed by a substance abuse treatment
22	practitioner licensed by the Department of Health Professions.
23	Any person who fails or refuses to participate in a screening or assessment without good cause or
24	who tests positive for the use of illegal substances shall be ineligible to receive TANF payments
25	pursuant to this chapter. Other members of a household that includes a person who has failed or
26	refused to participate in a screening or assessment or who has tested positive for the use of illegal
27 28	substances shall, if otherwise eligible, receive TANF payments pursuant to this chapter as protective or vendor payments to a third party payee for the benefit of the members of the household.

Persons deemed ineligible for TANF assistance due to failure or refusal to participate in a screening
or assessment or for testing positive for the use of illegal substances may reapply for assistance after 12
months have elapsed from the date of initial ineligibility.

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
