4	A BILL to amend and reenact § 3.2-6521 of the Code of Virginia, relating to local government rabies

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10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That § 3.2-6521 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
12	§ 3.2-6521. Rabies inoculation of companion animals; availability of certificate; rabies clinics.
13	A. The owner or custodian of all dogs and cats four months of age and older shall have such animal
14	currently vaccinated for rabies by a licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under
15	the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises unless otherwise
16	provided by regulations. The supervising veterinarian on the premises shall provide the owner or
17	custodian of the dog or the cat with a rabies vaccination certificate or herd rabies vaccination certificate
18	and shall keep a copy in his own files. The owner or custodian of the dog or the cat shall furnish within
19 20	a reasonable period of time, upon the request of an animal control officer, humane investigator,
20 21	law-enforcement officer, State Veterinarian's representative, or official of the Department of Health, the certificate of vaccination for such dog or cat. The vaccine used shall be licensed by the U.S. Department
²¹ 22	of Agriculture for use in that species. At the discretion of the local health director, a medical record
$\frac{22}{23}$	from a licensed veterinary establishment reflecting a currently vaccinated status may serve as proof of
23 24	vaccination.
2 4 25	B. All rabies clinics must be approved require the approval by the appropriate local health
2 6	department and governing body. Rabies clinics shall be held at least once per year when the governing
27 27	body finds that the number of resident veterinarians is otherwise inadequate to meet the need. The
28	licensed veterinarian who administers rabies vaccinations at the clinic shall (i) provide the owner or
29	custodian a rabies vaccination certificate for each vaccinated animal and (ii) ensure that a licensed
30	veterinary facility retains a copy of the rabies vaccination certificate. The sponsoring organization of a
31	rabies clinic shall, upon the request of the owner or custodian, an animal control officer, a humane
32	investigator, a law-enforcement officer, a State Veterinarian's representative, a licensed veterinarian, or
33	an official of the Department of Health, provide the name and contact information of the licensed
34	veterinary facility where a copy of the rabies vaccination certificate is retained. However, the local
35	governing body shall conduct a rabies clinic at least once every three years.

36 C. Vaccination subsequent to a summons to appear before a court for failure to do so shall not 37 operate to relieve such owner from the penalties or court costs provided under § 16.1-69.48:1 or 38 17.1-275.7.

39 D. The Board of Health shall, by regulation, provide an exemption to the requirements of subsection 40 A if an animal suffers from an underlying medical condition that is likely to result in a life-threatening condition in response to vaccination and such exemption would not risk public health and safety. For the 41 42 purposes of § 3.2-6522, such exemption shall mean that the animal is considered not currently vaccinated for rabies. For the purposes of §§ 3.2-5902, 3.2-6526, and 3.2-6527, such exemption shall be 43 44 considered in place of a current certificate of vaccination.

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
