10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 54.1-2963.2 as follows:
12	§ 54.1-2963.2. Lyme disease testing information disclosure.
13	Every physician licensed pursuant to this chapter shall provide the following notice related to Lyme
14	disease to each patient for whom a laboratory test for the presence of Lyme disease is ordered:
15	ACCORDING TO THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION, AS OF 2011
16	LYME DISEASE IS THE 6TH FASTEST GROWING DISEASE IN THE UNITED STATES.
17	YOUR PHYSICIAN HAS ORDERED A LABORATORY TEST FOR THE PRESENCE OF LYME
18	DISEASE FOR YOU. CURRENT LABORATORY TESTING FOR LYME DISEASE CAN BE
19	PROBLEMATIC AND STANDARD LAB TESTS OFTEN RESULT IN FALSE NEGATIVE AND FALSE
20	POSITIVE RESULTS, AND IF DONE TOO EARLY, YOU MANY NOT HAVE PRODUCED ENOUGH
21	ANTIBODIES TO BE CONSIDERED POSITIVE BECAUSE YOUR IMMUNE RESPONSE REQUIRES
22	TIME TO DEVELOP ANTIBODIES. IF YOU ARE TESTED FOR LYME DISEASE, AND THE RESULTS
23	ARE NEGATIVE, THIS DOES NOT NECESSARILY MEAN YOU DO NOT HAVE LYME DISEASE. IF
24	YOU CONTINUE TO EXPERIENCE UNEXPLAINED SYMPTOMS, YOU SHOULD BE RETESTED
25	PERIODICALLY AND YOU SHOULD CONTACT YOUR PHYSICIAN IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS
26	OR CONCERNS.
