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13102214D **HOUSE BILL NO. 2049** 1 House Amendments in [] - February 4, 2013 2 3 A BILL to amend and reenact §§ 33.1-1 and 33.1-2 of the Code of Virginia, relating to composition of 4 the Commonwealth Transportation Board. 5 Patron Prior to Engrossment-Delegate Rust 6 7 Referred to Committee on Transportation 8 9 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That §§ 33.1-1 and 33.1-2 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as follows: 10 § 33.1-1. State Highway and Transportation Board continued as Commonwealth Transportation 11 Board; number and terms of members; removal from office; Commonwealth Transportation 12 Commissioner continued as Commissioner of Highways; vacancies. 13 The State Highway and Transportation Board, formerly known as the State Highway and 14 15 Transportation Commission, is continued and shall hereafter be known as the Commonwealth Transportation Board. Wherever either "Commission" or "Board" is used in this title referring to the 16 State Highway and Transportation Board or the State Highway and Transportation Commission, it shall 17 mean the Commonwealth Transportation Board. 18 19 The Board shall consist of seventeen [ 20 21 ] members: the Secretary of Transportation, the 20 Commissioner of Highways, the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation, and fourteen [ 17 18 ] citizen members. The citizen members shall be (i) appointed by the Governor as 21 22 provided in § 33.1-2, (ii) subject to confirmation by the General Assembly, and (iii) removable from 23 office during their respective terms by the Governor at his pleasure. Appointments of citizen members 24 shall be for terms of four years commencing upon July 1, upon the expiration of the terms of the 25 existing members, respectively. The initial terms of the members appointed in January, 1987, shall commence when appointed and shall be for terms ending June 30, 1988, June 30, 1989, and June 30, 26 27 1990, respectively. Vacancies shall be filled by appointment by the Governor for the unexpired term and 28 shall be effective until 30 days after the next meeting of the ensuing General Assembly and, if 29 confirmed, thereafter for the remainder of the term. No person shall be eligible to serve more than two 30 successive terms of four years, other than the Secretary of Transportation, the Commissioner of 31 Highways, and the Director of the Department of Rail and Public Transportation. A person heretofore or 32 hereafter appointed to fill a vacancy may serve two additional successive terms. 33 The Secretary of Transportation shall serve as Chairman of the Board. The Secretary shall have voting privileges only in the event of a tie. The Commissioner of Highways shall serve as 34 35 Vice-Chairman of the Board. The Commissioner shall have voting privileges only in the event of a tie 36 when he is presiding during the absence of the Chairman. The Director of the Department of Rail and 37 Public Transportation shall serve without a vote. Whenever in this title and in the Code of Virginia "State Highway Commission" or "State Highway 38 and Transportation Board" is used, it shall mean "Commonwealth Transportation Board"; "State 39 Highway Commissioner" or "State Highway and Transportation Commissioner" or "Commonwealth 40 Transportation Commissioner" shall mean Commissioner of Highways; and all references to "Department 41 of Highways and Transportation" shall refer to the Department of Transportation. 42 § 33.1-2. Residence requirements; statewide interest. 43 44 Of such Board, one member shall be a resident of the territory now included in the Bristol 45 construction district, one in the Salem construction district, one in the Lynchburg construction district, 46 one in the Staunton construction district, one in the Culpeper construction district, one in the Fredericksburg construction district, one two in the Richmond construction district, one two in the 47 48 Hampton Roads construction district, and one two in the Northern Virginia construction district. The 49 remaining five members shall be appointed from the Commonwealth at large, but at least two shall reside in standard metropolitan statistical planning areas and be designated as urban at-large members, 50 51 and at least [ two three ] shall reside outside standard metropolitan statistical planning areas and be 52 designated as rural at-large members. The at-large members shall be appointed to represent rural and 53 urban transportation needs and be mindful of the concerns of seaports and seaport users, airports and 54 airport users, railways and railway users, and mass transit and mass transit users. Each member so appointed shall be mindful of the best interest of the Commonwealth at large primarily instead of those 55 of the district from which chosen or of the transportation interest represented. 56
